

Maundy Thursday, April 17, 2025 Welcome to Worship!

Tonight is Holy Thursday, otherwise known as Maundy Thursday. "Maundy" means "mandate," which refers to Jesus's command to his disciples the night before his death. In John's Gospel, Jesus says, "I give you a new commandment, that you love one another" (Jn. 13:34). His statement is an encapsulation of the Christian faith. We are created to love and be loved. Jesus not only speaks of love; he is love incarnate.

Jesus demonstrates his love by washing his disciples' feet and instituting the Lord's Supper. In other words, Jesus's love is experienced as he washes feet and serves a meal. No matter where we live or how we were raised, all human beings do the work of cleaning and feeding every day. How remarkable is it to see Jesus, Lord of the universe, love us in a way that quite literally stoops him down to our level? He humbles himself to a degree that the disciples find alarming. Tonight, we model after Christ by humbling ourselves in service to one another. As we approach Good Friday, Maundy Thursday helps us meditate on God's principal commandment. After all, love is a verb.

Going Forth Prayer: Lord, we thank you for your humility and sacrifice. Tonight, instill in us the desire to continue serving you. *Amen*.
